This meeting is your chance to hear what God has been doing by his grace in our church during 2023.

It is also an opportunity to offer your voice and prayers to help us discern how we might do God's will in the future, particularly through:

- election of Churchwardens
- election of members of the PCC

Any member of the congregation who is on the church electoral roll is eligible to stand for these positions and to vote at the meeting. Nomination forms are available in the church.

If you are interested, you will need to be proposed and seconded.

## **Electoral Roll**

The church electoral roll is the foundation of the whole structure of synodical government in the church.

Do you want to have a say in the work of St Michael and All Angels? Then you need to be on the electoral roll.

Inclusion on the electoral roll does not involve any payment.

It is the parish's register of names and addresses of those qualified to attend and to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM), to stand for election to the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and the parish's representatives on the Deanery Synod.

To apply for the church electoral roll, you must:

- be 16 years old or over
- be baptised
- either live in the parish or have attended the church regularly for at least 6 months
