




As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Electoral Roll Renewal


In every parish there must be a church Electoral Roll on which the names of lay persons are entered. It is your parish's register of electors who can vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) which this year is scheduled to take place on Sunday 25th May.

The Electoral Roll is normally just revised annually, but every sixth year it must be completely renewed, meaning that everyone on the current Roll must come off and re-apply.

Whether you are on our existing Roll or not, you will therefore need to complete a fresh Electoral Roll form. This can be done between 27th March and 10th May, either by collecting a form from the church or downloading a copy from our website.
