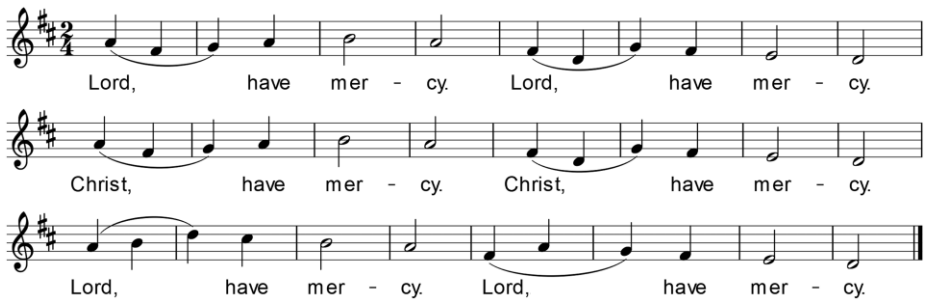

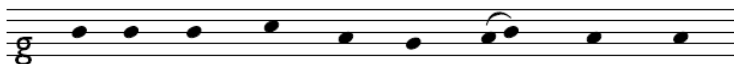

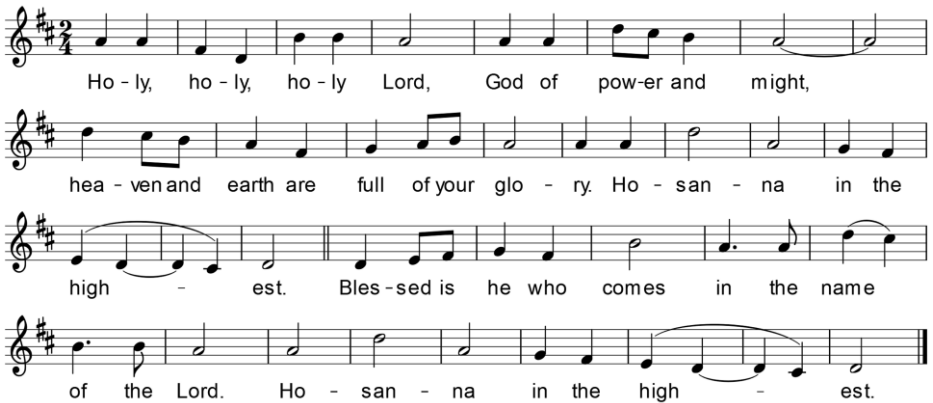


R. **It is right to give thanks and praise.**

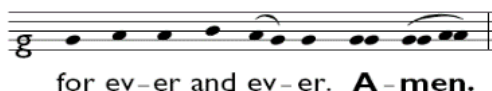
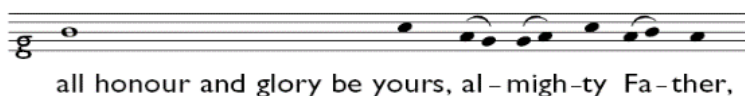
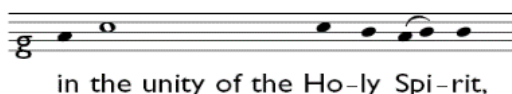
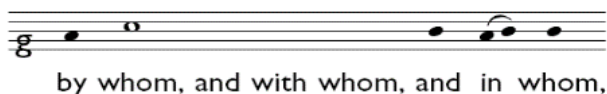
Great is the mystery of faith:



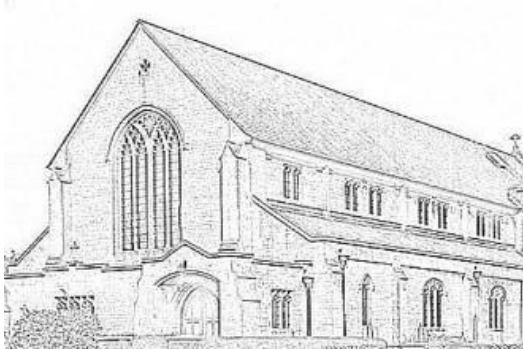

Under 5 years old free.

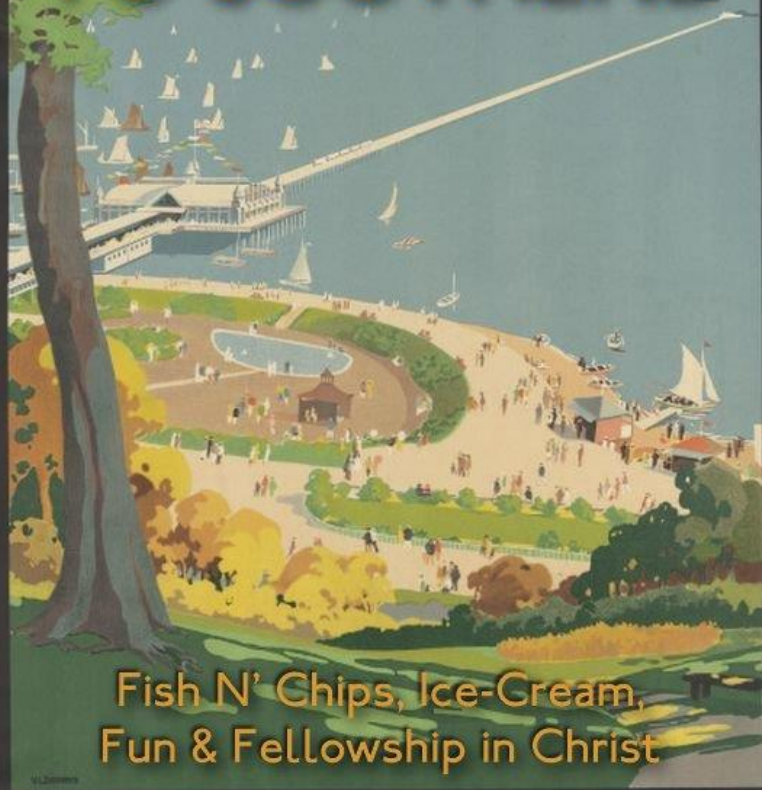
All children must be accompanied by a responsible adult.
